PSAT Test at CHS: CHS is proud to offer the PSAT test for ALL 9th, 10th, and 11th graders on October 19 (Seniors will arrive at 9AM on Wednesday and have breakfast and a class movie followed by college and career workshops during test time). The PSAT serves as a practice test for the SAT, an indicator of which AP courses your student should consider, and an identifier of
